Alcott, Louisa May	<u>Little Women</u> Follow the lives of four sisters in nineteenth-century New England.
Baum, L. Frank.	<u>The Wizard Of Oz.</u> An elegant and rich story about a girl, her friends, and a humbug wizard.
Burnett, Frances Hodgson	<u>The Secret Garden.</u> A young orphan named Mary is sent to live at a creepy English estate where she discovers a secret garden.
Burnford, Sheila.	<u>The Incredible Journey.</u> A dog and cat trio travel 250 miles across Canada to find their owner.
Carroll, Lewis.	<u>Alice's Adventures in Wonderland.</u> Alice falls down a rabbit hole and experiences some unusual adventures with a variety of nonsensical and amusing characters.

Lin, Grace	<u>The Year of the Dog</u> Pacy finds a new best friend, enters the science fair, has a role in the school play, enters a writing competition and celebrates the New Year.
Look, Lenore	<u>Alvin Ho: Allergic to Girls, School, and Other Scary Things</u> A young boy who loves superheroes and comes from a long line of brave Chinese farmer-warriors, wants to make friends, but first he must overcome his fear of everything.
Martin, Ann M.	<u>Welcome to Camden Falls</u> After their parents die, Flora and her sister Ruby move to Camden Falls to live with their grandmother.
Naylor, Phyllis.	<u>Shiloh</u> A boy finds a dog that has been abused, but must return it to its legal owner.

O'Connor, Barbara	<u>On The Road to Mr. Mineo's</u> Life in a sleepy southern town turns upside down when a one- legged pigeon shows up and everyone decides that they want him for themselves.
Palacio, R.J.	<u>Wonder</u> A story told from multiple view points about a boy born with a facial deformity so severe, he has not been able to go to school. But now he will be starting 5 <sup>th</sup> grade at a school, he wants nothing more than for people to accept him.
Park, Linda Sue	<u>Project Mulberry</u> When Julia, a Korean American girl, and her friend Patrick, do a silkworm project for their after-school club project, they learn more than they expect.
Patron, Susan	<u>The Higher Power of Lucky</u> All Lucky needs in life is a little luck and permanence and so, when she fears that her guardian will leave her and go back to France, ten-year-old Lucky decides to take things into her own hands.
Pennypacker, Sara	<u>Summer of the Gypsy Moths</u> While Stella does not mind living with her somewhat cold aunt Louise on Cape Cod, she does mind living with another foster child that Louise has taken in. But when Louise unexpectedly dies, both girls must figure out what to do.
Ryan, Pam Muñoz	<u>Paint the Wind</u> Maya, an orphan, leaves her extremely restricted life in California to stay with her mother's family on a Wyoming ranch, where she discovers a wild mare that her mother once rode.
Schroeder, Lisa	<u>It's Raining Cupcakes</u> Twelve-year-old Isabel dreams of seeing the world and so she enters a baking contest whose winners travel to New York City.
Shang, Wendy Wan Long	<u>The Great Wall of Lucy Wu</u> Lucy is all geared up to have a fantastic year in sixth grade until she learns that her great aunt will be visiting from China – and she will be sharing her bedroom.
Telgemeier, Raina	<u>Smile</u> A graphic novel that chronicles the complications that a middle school girl faces when an accident knocks out her two front teeth
Urban, Linda	<u>Crooked Kind of Perfect</u> Ten-year-old Zoe wants to play the piano- she gets an organ, instead. Things often do not go as Zoe would like, but Zoe always seems to make the most of things.
Wiles, Deborah	<u>Each Little Bird that Sings</u> Ten-year-old Comfort is used to death. After all, her family owns a funeral home. But sometimes dealing with loss can be difficult. A warm story with lots of humor and a bit of heartbreak.
Williams-Garcia, Rita	<u>One Crazy Summer</u> During the summer of 1968, three sisters are sent from Brooklyn to Oakland to stay with their mother who left when they were little. A story about family, social unrest, and a part of American History that is rarely explored.
Woodson, Jacqueline.	<u>Locomotion</u> In a series of poems, African American, eleven-year-old Lonnie writes about his life in Brooklyn during a particularly difficult year.



Raskin, Ellen.	<u>The Westing Game</u> The residents of an apartment building compete for the inheritance of an eccentric millionaire's fortune as they try to solve a mystery.
Sachar, Louis.	<u>Holes</u> A boy is sent to a camp for wayward boys where he spends his days digging holes without knowing what he is looking for.
Selznick, Brian	<u>The Invention of Hugo Cabret</u> A twelve-year-old orphan, secretly living and repairing clocks within the walls of a Paris train station in 1931, meets a mysterious toyseller and his goddaughter. Also try <u>Wonderstruck</u> by the same author.
Soup, Dr. Cuthbert	<u>Another Whole Nother Story</u> Ethan Cheeseman and his three children hope to complete work on a time machine, but spies and government agents have been pursuing them for two years and are about to catch up.
Stanley, Diane	<u>The Mysterious Matter of I. M. Fine</u> Noticing that a popular series of horror novels is having a bizarre effect on the behavior of its readers, Franny and Beamer set out to find the mysterious author.
Stead, Rebecca	<u>When You Reach Me</u> As her mother prepares to be a contestant on a 1980's television game show, a twelve-year-old New York City girl tries to make sense of a series of mysterious notes received from an anonymous source.
Stewart, Trenton Lee	<u>The Mysterious Benedict Society</u> After passing a series of really challenging tests, four children are chosen to go on a dangerous secret mission.
Van Draanen, Wendelin.	<u>Sammy Keyes</u> series. In this popular series, thirteen-year-old Sammy uses her detective skills to solve crazy mysteries ranging from missing cats to hotel robberies.
Wood, Maryrose	<u>The Incurable Children of Ashton Place: The Mysterious Howling</u> Fifteen-year-old Miss Penelope Lumley, a recent graduate of the Swanburne academy for Poor Bright Females, is hired as governess to three very unusual young children.

After reluctantly kissing a frog, an awkward, fourteen-year-old princess suddenly finds herself a frog too and sets off with the prince to seek the means to become human again.

Orphaned Peter finds himself helping his new friend, a Starcatcher, in a struggle to keep the magical stardust out of the hands of greedy pirates

Duane, Diane.	<u>So You Want To Be a Wizard.</u> Thirteen-year-old Nita, tormented by a gang of bullies because she won't fight back, finds the help she needs in a library book on wizardry.
Eager, Edward.	<u>Half Magic.</u> Three children find a magic charm but only half of the wishes can come true.
Funke, Cornelia Caroline.	<u>Dragon Rider</u> After learning that humans are headed toward his hidden home, a dragon is joined by a brownie and an orphan boy to find a legendary valley.
Hale, Shannon	<u>The Princess Academy</u> When it is predicted that the Prince will find a bride from the mountains, Miri is sent to an academy with other girls from the region.
Hatke, Ben	<u>Zita the Spacegirl</u> When her friend is abducted by aliens, Zita rushes to his rescue in this graphic novel.
Horvath, Peggy	<u>Everything on a Waffle</u> When eleven-year-old Primrose's parents are lost at sea, she finds herself living with a distant relative and learning a lot about recipes, human nature, and life.

Juster, Norman.	<u>The Phantom Tollbooth</u> A boy named Milo receives a mysterious package containing the cure for his boredom. A must-read for those who enjoy puns and plays on words!
Kessler, Liz	<u>The Tail of Emily Windsnap</u> After finally convincing her mother that she should take swimming lessons, Emily discovers a terrible and wonderful secret about herself.
Kibuishi, Kazu	<u>Amulet : The Stonekeeper</u> After moving their ancestral home, Emily and Navin's mother is kidnapped by a creature that leads the children on a deadly chase into a magical world .

- Cushman, Karen. Rodzina  
A twelve-year old Polish American girl is put on an orphan train in Chicago and sent out West to find a home.
- Giff, Patricia Reilly. Lily's Crossing  
While spending the summer of 1944 at Rockaway Beach, Lily's friendship with a young Hungarian refugee causes her to see the war and her own world differently.
- Holm, Jennifer L. Turtle in Paradise  
In 1935, when her mother gets a job housekeeping, eleven-year-old Turtle is sent to stay with relatives she has never met in Key West, Florida.
